ART'S HOUSEHOLD TIPS

Now that Fall is here, gutters get full very fast. Inspect your gutters regularly. Gutters should be cleaned at least once after all the leaves have fallen and again in the spring. If you have a lot of trees and heavy rains you will want to clean them more often.

Use a ladder tall enough to reach the gutter but DO NOT prop it on the gutter, as doing so can bend the gutter out of shape causing low spots where water can collect. Wearing gloves, clean the gutters with a whisk broom to remove all large debris from the system. Next flush your system with a hose. This flushing will give you the opportunity to observe the flow of the water and check for any low spots.

When cleaning your gutters inspect each hanger for any bent straps and popped nails. Any loose nails or screws should be tightened or replaced. To keep downspouts clear, flush them with a garden hose. If necessary remove stubborn clogs by forcing the hose down the downspout.

For best wear and protection, paint the outsides of the gutters with oil-based exterior house paint and coat the insides with an asphalt roofing paint which will make them rust resistant.
