Teams of specially trained volunteers and their dogs are available for visitations to patients in all units except maternity, emergency, and neonatal ICU. With physician approval, patients can request a PAT visit and delight in the dogs that are registered Delta Pet Partners. The dogs range from 6 pounds to 130 pounds.

Lynne became interested in PAT when her daughter broke her femur 9 years ago and the only thing that seemed to help her spirits was a Therapy Dog. Libby is a 3 year-old yellow lab, and Madison is a 12 year-old Golden Retriever. Madison has been chosen as one of the best Therapy Dogs in the nation. Unfortunately, dogs get the same diseases as humans and Madison has a benign tumor on her pituitary gland and cushings disease.
