Workers are paid for their services according to their participation and productivity, and receive vacation pay, bonuses and workers compensation benefits.

Lincoln Training Center serves over 500 clients annually at more than 50 job sites throughout California. Our goal remains constant: to create successful employment partnerships between the business community and persons with disabilities.

Come to the Center on any given day and you will be inspired by this special place where adults with disabilities learn job skills, gain confidence, and achieve success in the workplace. Each individual is matched with a job and earns a paycheck, which leads to self-esteem and independence.
