Mr. Hundley is currently the producing artistic director of the San Gabriel Valley Music Theatre since 2008. He has held positions as the producing artistic director of the University Wits Repertory (a theatre company which was based in Hollywood, CA), and worked at the Los Angeles Opera helmed by the late Peter Hemmings and then Placido Domingo.

Bobby took over the helm of the San Gabriel Valley Music Center in 2008. It had been struggling in recent years and he was brought in to bring back theatre to the historic San Gabriel Playhouse. The historic auditorium was built in the 1920's.

During the war years the building was used as housing. There were people sleeping everywhere, even storing automobiles. In 1980 Bill Shaw, Ricky Lugo, and our own Roger Lockie ran the theatre with some big productions. In recent years it has been difficult to get families to the music theater. Bobby has devoted his time and talents with a theme of "Building Our Community On One Musical At A Time". The arts enhance the quality of life. High crime areas are not involved with the arts. It has been proven that students who are involved with the performing arts are better students going on to higher education and better paying jobs.

Bobby Hundley believes in what he is doing so much that he has donated his pay back to the music theatre since 2008. Bobby rated the Temple City Performing Arts under the direction of Matt Byers and Jon Howie as one of the best in the San Gabriel Valley. On a personal note: I was extremely impressed with his talk and in my opinion I wish every parent could hear him speak on the importance of the performing arts, but all the arts. Temple City is a great district because they realize the importance of providing a well-rounded education that not only focuses of academics, but visual and performing arts.
