He grew up in Temple City having graduated valedictorian (hmmm, valedictorian must be Armenian also, after all it ends in "ian"). He has an undergraduate degree in economics from UCLA, and holds a law degree and MBA from U.C. Berkeley finishing his last year at Harvard.

CAS has been in operation since 1923 providing assistance to residents needing medical equipment for in-home use at no charge and without time restraints. More than 18,000 items are available such as canes, commodes, walkers, wheelchairs, bath benches, transfer benches, hospital beds, trapezes, and much more. All equipment is repaired, cleaned, and sanitized. If equipment is too heavy or complicated to set up, such as a hospital bed, delivery service is available at no charge. Their service area includes all of the San Gabriel Valley. Their budget is just under \$500,000 per year. They accept donations including a lady in Pasadena that willed them 5 million.

I realize now just how small a world we live in. Dan's mother played the piano at our church in San Gabriel about 30 years ago. Dan also played baseball for Elmer Black's team and also Graham Music. He also worked flipping hamburgers at our TC McDonalds.
